An Interview with Author Juliana Goodman

Juliana Goodman was born and raised in Blue Island, Illinois. She received her BA in English Literature from Western Illinois University and her MFA in Fiction Writing from Purdue University. *The Black Girls Left Standing* depicts 16-year-old Beau Willet's brave journey to clear her sister's name after she is murdered by an off-duty police officer.

What is the inspiration for this story?

I was inspired by the #SAYHERNAME movement. There's a lot of pressure and expectations put on Black girls and women to protest police brutality, but when the victim is a Black girl or woman, the type of support you see is completely different.

I really wanted to explore how Black girls cope when they see another Black girl's death being ignored. How do you move forward in a country where your life is not seen as valuable? I also wanted to show what an isolating experience it could be for the families of victims of police brutality to grieve and heal after the world has turned its back on them.

What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

I usually write about topics I already have some firsthand knowledge of so I get started drafting right away. But once I get to a scene that requires specific knowledge that I don't have, then I'll pause and research. For example, there's a scene where the characters are taking a bus route that I've never been on. Luckily, YouTube had a video where a vlogger recorded their entire ride on this particular route. It seems small but the little details really help with authenticity.

How do you select the names of your characters?

I Google “rare and unusual baby names.” That’s how I chose the names Champion and Sonnet. I also get them from movies and TV. I actually named my protagonist Beau after the daughter in M. Night Shyamalan’s *Signs*. I just always thought it was a cute name for a girl.

What is the most difficult part of your artistic process?

The most difficult part is placing myself into the more traumatic scenes of a story. There were a lot of high-emotion scenes I wrote and then rewrote and then revised. Even though it’s not real, in that moment, I feel everything my protagonist is feeling. Those feelings can sometimes linger even after I’ve finished a scene, so I try to give myself enough time and space to recharge before I dive back into drafting.

Have you always wanted to be a writer?

Yes, at least since the first grade. There was short time in middle school I considered being an artist, but it never stuck. I was really quiet growing up, but I observed everything around me and I had all of these different thoughts and ideas but no one to tell them to. Writing has always been a way for me to say exactly what’s on my mind.

An Interview with Author Kacen Callender

Kacen Callender is the best-selling and award-winning author of multiple novels for children, teens, and adults, including the Stonewall Honor Book, *Felix Ever After*, and the National Book Award for Young People's Literature, *King and the Dragonflies*. *Lark & Kasim Start a Revolution* is their new moving and honest contemporary YA novel following Lark's journey to speak the truth and discover how their own self-love can be a revolution.

You've mentioned that your writing process is fluid, changing from book to book. How did you go about writing *Lark & Kasim Start a Revolution*? Was there anything special about that process in particular?

Yes, *Lark & Kasim* was special because it started as a book set in the year 2020, chapter one being in February – but as I wrote I realized there were challenges I didn't anticipate, like struggling to find ways for the characters to interact during quarantine. I also felt very tied to that year's events in a way that felt restricting to the story, and the novel became less about Lark and Kasim, and more about the year 2020. I shifted the setting so that it isn't exactly in the year 2020, but the characters are still affected by the pandemic. The original draft became essentially a very detailed outline where the plot pretty much stayed the same, but there was more space to add scenes with conflict and growth between the characters.

Oftentimes the more marginalized you are, the less room you have to make mistakes, and the more villainized you become when you inevitably make those mistakes. Lark and Kasim react quite differently to this concept, though we see this primarily through Lark's eyes as the protagonist. Were you ever tempted to split point of view with Kasim? How do you think the story may have changed if Kasim was our protagonist instead of Lark?

The point about having less space to make mistakes as a marginalized person is one I'd learned from writing *Felix Ever After*, after seeing the response to Felix as a character who makes mistakes and needs to learn and grow, as is generally what a character's story arc is meant to be. The double standard of Felix making mistakes and not being given that space, and seeing white, straight, cis characters allowed to make similar mistakes and shown the love that Felix also deserved, was the original inspiration for *Lark & Kasim*. Kasim represents the character who isn't allowed to make mistakes and accepts his anger about this fact, knowing he is worth more, and Lark is on the other end of the spectrum – the character who I think non-marginalized, privileged people prefer to see: someone who is willing to fawn and people-please for their safety as a human being and, on the more meta level, as a character in a YA novel. Because of this, I feel like I've already written Kasim's perspective. He's basically Felix 2.0, and is someone who helps spark the revolution in Lark, helping them to accept and love themselves and find enough safety to know they are allowed to make mistakes and learn and grow.

Similarly, this book explores the gray area between shame and accountability. Can you tell us about how you distinguished between the two, and how Lark and Kasim differentiated (or struggled to differentiate) bullying from being asked to take accountability?

A lot of my thoughts on shame versus accountability came from my own experiences with social media, and witnessing (and sometimes participating in) the callouts. Sometimes these callouts were around a person creating a horrendously racist caricature in their novel. Sometimes the callouts were because someone did something that majority people deemed silly, or had an opinion that was different from most, and so was deemed harmful. I was doing a lot of thinking and blogging about why this made me uncomfortable, and I was finally able to land on what is currently in Lark's story, and what Lark and Kasim end up learning for themselves through the plot and Lark's own mistakes: if a person makes a harmful mistake, accountability must be taken. But there is a difference between asking for accountability and shaming, which I think has more to do with the intent of the person doing the shaming than the person who made the mistake. When it becomes less about the person taking accountability to right their wrong, and more about having the opportunity to use their mistake as an excuse to destroy them because it's fun and it feels good, then I believe we have entered a bullying territory where no one is truly safe, because we will all inevitably be the person who will make that mistake, too.

Lark's journey is ultimately about discovering how to love themselves joyously. Did you learn anything from Lark as you wrote their story? Did you happen to learn anything about yourself along the way?

Lark's character and story is a reflection of myself and my own lessons, but one thing new I learned from writing the novel is that taking accountability is in a way a form of self-love – realizing that every human being, including me, will make mistakes, and deserve the space to learn and grow with self-compassion.

An Interview with Author Emi Nietfeld

In her latest book, *Acceptance*, Emi Nietfeld details her journey from a troubled childhood – including family issues, homelessness, and addiction – to the heights of the academic world, and the resilience it took to get there.

Why did you decide to write this story now?

Well, I started writing it 12 years ago, in 2010, when I was a senior in high school. I found the college application process so gutting and bizarre. It forced me to package all these bad things – my parents' mental illnesses, being in foster care and homeless – and act like I'd overcome these circumstances, when I was still in the middle of them. I couldn't shake the feeling that I was going through a gauntlet that fundamentally changed me, the way I saw myself, and my view of the world.

In college, I stopped writing. After selling my past, I wanted to get as far away from it as possible. But once I graduated and was working as a software engineer at Google, I was haunted by a feeling that I had "cheated" my way in by framing my story in a certain way in my applications. I was filled with "survivor guilt," unsure of why I made it out when so many others did not. So it began as a kind of confession.

But as I looked more closely, it became an investigation of society's unrealistic expectations put on youth in difficult circumstances. I wanted to get to the bottom of what happened to me and what's happening to so many other kids.

What does the title mean?

I came up with the title *Acceptance* right away. It was less about “acceptance” in terms of getting into college, and more about this ideology that had been drilled into me in therapy. I was 13 and 14, living with my mom who was a hoarder, in a house filled with mice where we often lacked hot water, and yet counselors were telling me – and the other kids – that we were miserable because we failed to accept our circumstances. They told us that the key to mental health was acceptance. That seemed completely ridiculous to me at the time.

I did not accept my circumstances. I became obsessed with college as my way out. So titling this book *Acceptance* feels like an act of rebellion.

What do you hope people who work with teenagers take from this book?

So many people say, “It doesn’t matter where you go to college,” but that minimizes the situation. The pressure teenagers face is so, so real. We live in an era of massive inequality. Growing up, my mom had one of these union jobs that’s quickly disappearing. That seemed like the only reason we had any stability. Even at 14, I saw how hard it was to make it in an environment where so few jobs even have insurance. In a “Life Skills” class I took, we job hunted; almost all the jobs that paid above minimum wage required a degree. When we balanced our hypothetical budgets, the only way to make it work was allocating \$32 a month to health care. Many of us were taking medications with sticker prices of \$1,000 a month.

Years later, when the Operation Varsity Blues scandal broke – where rich parents bribed their kids’ way into Ivies (Ivy League Universities) – I wasn’t surprised at all. We live in a world where it’s increasingly hard to make it as a teacher or a nurse or a barista. Of course parents are afraid for their kids. Of course kids are terrified.

Blaming it on mental health or reducing it to simply the role of social media hides the stress inherent to living in such a cutthroat world.

If you could go back in time and offer advice to your 14-year-old self, what would you tell her?

This is a hard question because I don’t think that, at 14, what I needed was advice. But if my 14-year-old self could’ve just known that one day I would be 29, and happily married, and live in New York – maybe I could’ve calmed down. The knowledge that my life today was even possible would’ve been a huge relief.

The other thing I wish I’d known was how tied up I felt I was to my situation. When I was in foster care, living with a family who didn’t support my ambition, I asked my psychiatrist if I’d always be depressed. She replied that she thought it was like cancer: I’d go into remission for a while, but never really recover. This idea made me even more depressed! The relentless focus on my mental health and trying to improve it, without changing my life, made me fear that things would always suck.

But as I got older, I began to realize just how situational some of my problems were. For almost a decade, I had a voice in my head constantly chattering “I want to die, I want to die.” My junior year of college, for unrelated reasons, I made sleep my #1 priority. As soon as I began getting enough rest, the voice in my head telling me to kill myself just shut up. Even now, when I don’t sleep well for two nights in a row, it comes back, and I have to go to bed early.

What is the college admissions process like for someone from a background like yours?

When I was 15, I was under the illusion that getting into an elite school was about having good grades and test scores. Then I read a book called *Rock Hard Apps* that showed me exactly how much of it is marketing. I was very lucky that the author, a celebrity college counselor named Dr. Katherine Cohen, agreed to take me on pro-bono. If it hadn't been for her, I wouldn't have known how to tell the story.

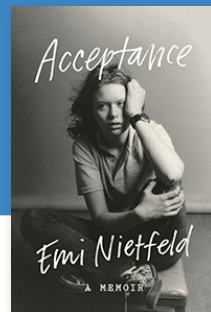
It seems like it should be straightforward enough to say "I was in foster care and now I often don't have a place to live," but it wasn't that easy. I had a mom who loved me very much, even though she couldn't take care of me. It was hard for me to even trust my version of reality. I had been told that I was in foster care because of my misbehavior; blaming other people for my issues had been a cardinal sin. When I was in residential treatment, I'd been forced to take responsibility for *everything* that I'd done. Even acknowledging that circumstances influenced things was enough to get a harsh punishment.

College admissions was the exact opposite. I had one chance to tell the story: it had to be clear and straightforward, immediately digestible. I had to be damaged in just the right ways, but not a risk to the school. I learned this the hard way when I applied early action to Yale and mentioned that I'd been in mental health treatment and was rejected. How could someone in that position not have emotional consequences? But it was all about marketing. I removed any reference to mental illness and got into Harvard in the regular admissions round. It takes heroics to have a stable life.
